

SWIMMER'S RESONSIBILITIES

1. A swimmer must have a working knowledge based on the coaches' evaluation of the backstroke, breaststroke, butterfly and freestyle.
2. Each swimmer must attend three scheduled practices. Promptness is expected; be on time. Tardiness will be disciplined and poor attendance will affect one's place in the line-up for a dual meet.
3. A written note from the parents or guardians to the coaches or notation in the attendance log book is mandatory for absence from practices or meets. If a meet is to be missed, the coaches must be advised by the Thursday preceding the meet.
4. Good behavior is expected from all swimmers participating on the team. Swimmers are to show respect and cooperation to the coaches at all times. Disruptive behavior will be subjected to punishment.
5. Each swimmer will abide by the coaches' decisions as to the events he/she will swim.
6. Each swimmer is responsible for knowing the events he/she is assigned to swim.
7. Each team member will follow all team rules.

PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Active participation is expected.
2. Parents are expected to support the fund raisers by having the swimmer(s) participate, by working the fund-raising event(s), and/or by helping to raise money.
3. Parents are needed to work the meets. Training will be available for various jobs: timing, running scores, scoring, judging, set-up or break-down, concessions, etc.
4. Parents must provide transportation to practices and meets.
5. Parents need to encourage, motivate, and support the swimmers. The nature of the sport requires hours of dedicated practice.
6. Due to the size of the team and the time constraints put on practices, **we ask that parents not approach the coaches during practice time** to discuss concerns they may be having. If you need to talk to the coaches about anything, there will be time after each practice. If you are unable to meet with the coaches after practice, feel free to talk with any Parent Board member to help you address your concerns.
